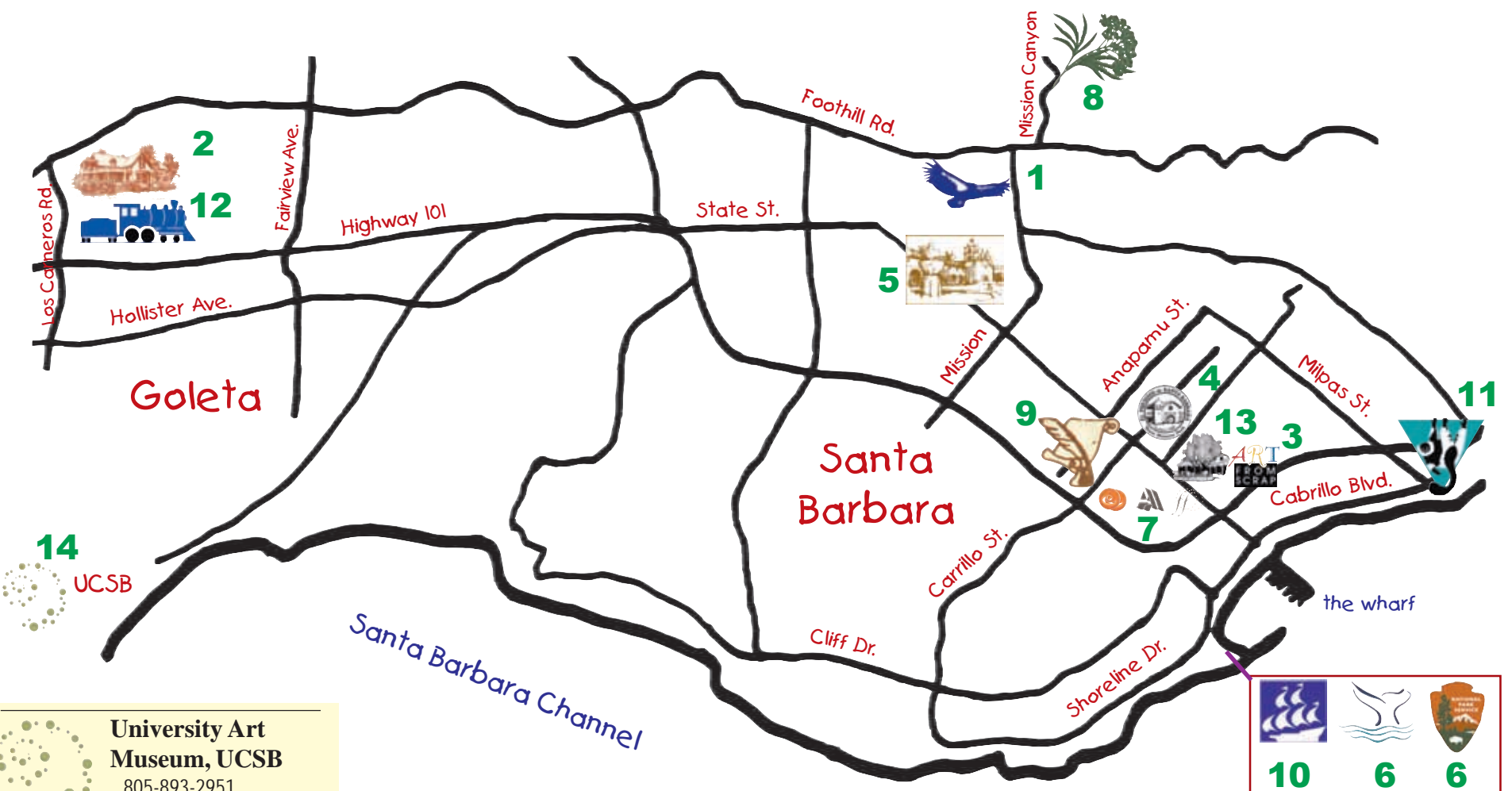
Where in Santa Barbara?
